

## Using Surveys to Evaluate Impact Workshop Program

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| 14:00 | Welcome and introduction   |
|       | Surveys as a method of data collection for evaluating impact   |
| 14:10 | This presentation introduces surveys as an approach to gathering impact data. This session covers important decisions you will need to make about the overall design of your impact evaluation survey (e.g., post-only vs. repeated measures; quantitative only vs. mixed or qualitative only).  |
|       | Planning your overall impact evaluation survey structure (Breakout Groups)   |

|       | <ul> <li>A) What is this survey aiming to reveal?</li> <li>B) What are the target respondents for this survey (this needs to be taken into account in decisions about duration of survey, level of difficult of question phrasing, etc.)</li> <li>C) Will a repeated measures design work for your project?</li> </ul>   |

| 15:00 | Measuring outcomes using survey questions (Breakout Groups)<br>The session is designed to help you hone your ability to develop relevant survey questions<br>and response options.   |
|       | This session will start with a brief presentation showing a set of examples of <u>closed-ended</u> survey questions designed to measure impact to give you some starting ideas on the range of options available to you. Then, you will develop survey questions to measure outcomes relevant to your work, getting 'critical friend' feedback from your group and the facilitators. |
|       | Here, you will address:  |
|       | <ul><li>A) What outcomes are you targeting specifically?</li><li>B) How are you thinking of measuring these outcomes using <u>closed-ended</u> survey questions?</li></ul>   |
|       | Focus in this session on coming up with your measurement ideas and draft survey questions. The next session will focus on refinement.  |
